This is in continuation of the visit of the UGC Visiting Committee to consider the XI Plan General Development Grant Allocation to your University.

2. Based on the Report submitted by the XI Plan UGC Visiting Committee and availability of funds from the Government of India, UGC has approved the tentative XI Plan Allocation, subject to availability of funds from Government of India, in respect of your University as under:

	(Rs. in Lakhs)
i) General Development Grant	509.88
ii) Merged Schemes	198.50
iii) Internal Quality assurance cell	5.00

3. The 'on account' grant already under the above schemes released by UGC during XI Plan Period will be a part of XI Plan Allocation of the university. Further, funds for Merged Schemes is based on the eligibility criteria indicated in the XI Plan Guidelines. Therefore, the grant for each of the merged scheme will be released subject to the fulfillment of the eligibility criteria and other related norms as laid down for the purpose.
4. A new scheme called Internal Quality Assurance Cell has also been included in the merged schemes and an additional amount of Rs.5.00 lakhs has been allocated to each State University. The Guidelines of this Scheme may be seen on UGC website [www.ugc.ac.in](http://www.ugc.ac.in)
5. The XI Plan Allocation is subject to compliance of the Academic Reforms as already circulated by the UGC vide its D.O.No.F.1-2/2008 (XI Plan) dated 30<sup>th</sup> March/21<sup>st</sup> April, 2009 which is also available on UGC website [www.ugc.ac.in](http://www.ugc.ac.in).
6. In addition to above, the following Administrative Reforms may also be implemented:
- Implementation of the Govt. of India Reservation Policy of SC/ST.
  - All Statutory posts should be filled up the appointment through Selection Committee as per the UGC Regulations.
  - All vacant Teaching Posts should be filled up expeditiously.
  - Annual Accounts, Annual Reports and Quality assessment Status Report should be submitted in time i.e. by 31<sup>st</sup> December of every year.
7. The release of grant will also be linked to Academic and Administrative Reforms as well as compliance of various policies of Government of India rules.
8. You are also requested to utilize proportionate grant on half yearly basis. Any portion which remain unutilized will be considered to be lapsed. UGC will also consider to

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allocate the unutilized grant of the university to other universities which are better performing and are also following the various academic reforms as well as implementation of various policies of Government of India. Therefore, the University is advised to utilize the grant fully.

9. The amount recommended by the Visiting Committee for various merged schemes may be utilized as per guidelines of respective schemes available on UGC website. The anomaly if any as per pattern of assistance/guidelines may be brought to the notice of the Commission.
10. You are, therefore requested to re-work the priorities of university within the General Development Grant allocation as decided by the Commission and keeping in view the recommendation of the Visiting Committee. The revised proposal (item-wise and year-wise plan) in the prescribed format UGC (copy enclosed) may be sent within 15 days in duplicate along with the soft copy within the ceiling conveyed to University. After receipt of the item-wise allocation within the amount as decided by the Committee, the UGC will convey the final approval of XI Plan Allocation to the University.
11. A copy of the Report of the Visiting Committee is enclosed herewith for further necessary action at the University level.

12. Please give a brief note on the achievements of the University during X Plan

The X Plan assistance has been used for development of Library and infrastructure in the campus. There is a significant improvement in the facilities which the PG students can use for their academic pursuit. The plan helped to create infrastructure like Computer. The library procured books and journals out of the allotted grants.

13. Please give a brief note on the areas in which University needs improvement

University needs improvement in filling of vacant posts, faculty and students' development programmes, communication system and the organization of courses in broader fields as recommend in item 14.

14. Please give future insight recommended by the Committee for the University

### GENERAL OBSERVATIONS

1. The money allocated under the head of **Cluster Class Room** with multi-media facility may be suitably devised so as to meet the requirements of various departments.
2. There has been a globalization of higher education world over. Sanskrit as Language is dying stage and needs immediate revival. K.S. Darbhanga University can seek cooperation and collaboration with the Institutions of Higher

learning in the field of Sanskrit. This will provide an opportunity to the students and faculty for a global exposure and strengthen their academic standards.

3. All the existing sanctioned vacant positions should be filled-up immediately.
4. The faculty must be encouraged to apply for extra mural research from various funding agencies.
5. Existing Laboratories/equipments should be used by different departments/schools at central place like Computer Centre.
6. Computer should be procured for strengthening Computer Centre.
7. Internet facility may be provided to the teachers and scholar students. At least one terminal may be provided in each Hostel within the campus.
8. Library should maintain visitor register and should achieve full automation at the earliest. The furniture of the library should be remodelled for the convenience of the users. The stacking facility must be improved.
9. The library should assess the situation of books related to the syllabus and it should provide multiple copies of the course book being run in the University. Books in the Library should be purchased in consultation with the faculty members of the concerned department.
10. A proper Purchase Committee for the Department as well as Central Library Committee may be formed. All teachers' aspiration must be taken care while purchasing books.
11. The teacher of the University is met involved in planning for future academic environment of the University.
12. All traditional subjects may be made vocational in nature.
13. The University must ensure that available number of e-journals may be made available from the various consortia available in the country. They should be accessible from the different departments.

14. The standard Indian journals for each subject may be subscribed.
15. Adequate safety measures must be maintained in the University to prevent the historical monuments of Darbhanga Raj Building.
16. Centralized reprographic facility should be created within the premises of the library.
17. The university should create a separate students activity centre including cafeteria and recreation facilities.
18. A common placement Cell should be created for all departments.
19. The university should have a trained councillor for students.
20. There is lack of research activities among the faculties of the university, a strong initiative may be taken to encourage faculty to have research component as compulsory in the PG department.
21. An important feature of the university is not having much number of female students. Efforts should be made to attract female candidates to these courses.
22. The Committee appraised the University authority about "Ragging" problem as per directive of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India. The Ragging guidelines of the UGC were given to the Vice-Chancellor. The Vice-Chancellor informed to the Committee that K.S. Darbhanga University is free of Ragging. However, he has accepted to display catchy slogans on anti ragging at prominent places.
23. The world is presently moving into interdisciplinary areas wherein barriers between various subjects are getting obliterated. The University must sensitize its Faculty to incorporate this as a part of teaching activities.
24. Timing of classes should be from 9.00 a.m. to 5.00 p.m. in order to reduce pressure on classrooms and improve student teacher interaction.
25. Timing of Library should be enhanced from 07.00 A.M. to 07.00 P.M.

## **VISIT TO CENTRAL LIBRARY**

There are total number of 1,09,986 books in this library. Of these 36,986 were purchased out of X Plan grant. No proper records of reference books and general books have been kept for these.

There is no full time librarian. The library should be equipped with a reprographic unit.

There are more than 5000 manuscripts in the University. The University has published a catalogue of these, which is incomplete. The catalogue should be updated and its II part should be published,

## **VISIT TO BOYS HOSTELS**

There are three Boys Hostels in the University with total number of 33 rooms. More than 66 students are living in these, each room, though basically designed as single seated, occupied by at least two students. Proper facilities for boarding are wanting. No mess is being run. The students either prepare their food in the rooms or eat out side.

Furniture in the Hostels needs renovations/ replacement. Sanitation also needs improvement. There is no community hall or a reading room. These should be provided. Looking to the pressure of students, one more hostel should be constructed.

## **VISIT TO GIRLS HOSTEL**

There is one girl's hostel in the campus. The committee was informed that there are some girls students coming from outside Darbhanga desirous of living in the hostel. But the hostel has not been made operative yet.

## **VISIT TO HEALTH CENTER**

One Medical Officer is employed on full time basis in the Health Centre of the University. He is a very qualified person. There is only one compounded to assist him. The clinic is visited by nearly 5 to 10 patients daily.

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The Clinic is equipped with some very rare and sophisticated equipments like X Ray Machine, Photo Make, Dop testing, Elisa Machine Binocular Microscope, sonography equipment and analyzer for HIV. All the machines are in a good condition. The University has taken a right decision to allow private parties of specialists to utilize these Machines for treatment and tests of patients. This will keep the machines in a working condition and will also bring earnings to the University. There is no sweeper, no guard. The building is not properly maintained and it badly needs repair and renovations. A boundary wall should be erected for proper protection.

### **INTERACTION WITH TEACHING STAFF**

The committee met representatives of teaching staff on 25<sup>th</sup> July. Teachers from constituent and affiliated colleges of the University also attended the meeting.

90% of the colleges belonging to this university are located in rural and backward areas. They are facing financial problems. Funds for salary of the teaching staff only are provided by the state Govt.

There are 62 colleges under this University, 31 of them are designated as constituent colleges and 31 as affiliated colleges. F these only 19 colleges are recognized by the UGC under 12 B. The cases for 19 other colleges are under consideration for recognition under 12-B.

Total no. of sanctioned teaching posts in these colleges is 664. Of these, 261 posts are lying vacant. The University and State Govt. should take measures to fill the vacant posts.

The following suggestions were made by the teachers in the meeting –

1. A study centre for Mithila Culture should be established under the University.

2. There are only three rooms in the university guest house. Teachers visiting the University from colleges require proper lodging facilities for which the guest house should be extended.

### **INTERACTION WITH NON TEACHING STAFF**

The committee met the representatives of non-teaching staff of the University on 25<sup>th</sup> July. Ten employees attended the meeting.

The employees discussed various problems. There are no residential quarters for them in University campus.

Amount for constructions of residential accommodation for class III and class IV employees along with residential accommodation for the Registrar and PVC may be sanctioned.

### **INTERACTION WITH STUDENTS**

The meeting with students was attended by 13 students, including PG students and research scholars. The students complained that the provision for scholarships to all Sanskrit students in the University has been scrapped. They made the following suggestions –

1. Special scholarships should be provided for Sanskrit students.
2. A generator set should be installed in the Boys hostels to enable the students to study and work during power cut.
3. Facilities for working on Computer and Internet should be provided to them. They should also be given training in IT.
4. The UGC should establish a Sanskrit Cell to deal with the problems of Sanskrit Universities and students in these Universities.
5. Proper furniture should be arranged in Hostels and class rooms.
6. Arrangements for Reading Room, Mess and canteen should be made.

## **VISIT TO COMPUTER CENTRE**

Computer centre is housed in the Administrative Building of the University. It does not have adequate space. Preparation of Examination results, Admission forms and works related to statistical data of the University are done in the Centre. There are 5 computer systems, only one is connected with Internet. Broadband connection has not been obtained.

There are two Technical officers employed in the Centre. The Information Scientist running this Centre is qualified and efficient. This centre should be provided more computers to enable it to provide training to students.

The Committee feels that the Centre should be strengthened. It should also start Certificate and Diploma Courses. Rs. 50.00 lakh may be sanctioned for purchase of equipments including Computers and AC by the Centre and 50 lakh for constructions of its building.

## **MUSEUM**

The University maintains a museum of rare artefact and gift items donated by the late King Kameshwarsingh. Museum comprises very rare and antique items. In fact it is a unique heritage. Many of these very valuable articles including paintings of British period, royal dresses utensils etc. have been dumped in a hall on the second floor of the library and they are rusting.

The University should open a Museum in the main administrative building with proper storage and maintenance

The entry to this Museum should be ob ticket. This will bring sufficient amount for maintenance of the museum.

### **Mithila Centre for Culture and Innovative Studies**

The Committee decided to recommend to the UGC for set-up Institute of vocational studies based on traditional Mithila Culture. It is, therefore suggested that the Mithila Centre for Culture and Innovative Studies may be initiated in the K.S. Darbhanga University to preserve the dying culture heritage of Mithila for its revival. It is envisaged that this Institute may offer "Innovative Programme" consisting of Certificate six months, Diploma one year and Post Diploma two years in the following field : Music, Painting, Dance, Drama and Sculpture related to Mithila Culture only. And this Institute, it is proposed that the University may appoint a Professor/Reader as the Director out of the existing staff of the University. This Institute will require performing teacher from the respective various fields and there will be no need for requisite qualification of the teacher prescribed by the UGC. Here the teachers appoint will be based on Career Oriented Programme (COP) of the UGC. i.e a person of eminence in the field of Music like Drupadh, Expert of Madhubani Painting may be invited for teaching and practical work of this Institute.

#### **15. Observations of the Committee on the development plans of the University , in the following areas :**


- i. Access: The University informed that Bihar State Government reservation policy is followed in all the courses. The students belonged to the tribal as well as the economically and socially backward section of the society in the State.


- ii. Equity: There is hardly any female students keeping in view traditional and men dominated subjects like Sanskrit. However, efforts are required to attract female students.
- iii. Relevance: Although most of the courses were modified during X Plan, yet to make them more relevant, the courses should be updated and diversified periodically to make them competitive with other Indian Universities. The diversity is the key component of relevance in the changing context.
- iv. Quality & Excellence: Although the communication is poor, needs improvement of soft skills and personality needs further improvements. The students were of the opinion that the quality of teaching may be improved.
- v. University Administration: The University Administration needs to use e-governance for more efficient working. The competent authority should be wise vigilant and stern.
- vi. Development of Teachers: The faculty development programmes may be organized regularly in a diversified way so that they can not only improve the knowledge transfer effectively but also take care of related academic and other soft skills and attributed that can improve the employability of the students.
- vii. Facilities for Students: Better facilities for students in the areas of ICT, hostel, cafeteria, conveyance, health care, quality drinking water, etc. may be provided.
- viii. Other Plans: New courses with vocation are to be started only after creating minimum infrastructure and teaching faculty. Placement facility may be strengthened.


ix. Any other observation (s) of the visiting committee


1. All the vacant sanctioned posts must be filled at the earliest to strengthen the teaching and research within the university. This has to be given top priority before launching XI Plan initiative.
2. The Committee visited hostels (women/men) and found that the hostels were inadequate in accommodating students per room and facility provided. Bathrooms, kitchen, recreation rooms and general maintenance need immediate attention of the university authority. Regular maintenance and renovation could be carried out periodically.


