It is self financed Private University which has come into existence on 21st March, 2012 by enactment of Act (Act No. 6 of 2012) by Rajasthan State legislative Assembly. It has the mandate to promote research and education (Maharaj Vinayak Global University, Jaipur Act 2012 (Act No. 6 of 2012))

(iii)	Brief description of the University and its faculties/courses	Maharaj Vinayak Global University, Jaipur is running Jaipur Dental College (JDC), Jaipur Nursing College, Jaipur Physiotherapy College, Jaipur Occupational Therapy College, Jaipur School of Law. The colleges are running Bachelor in Dentistry, Masters in Dental Surgery, Bachelor in Physical Therapy, Masters in Physical Therapy in Various disciplines, Bachelor in Occupational Therapy, BSc Nursing, Post Basic BSc nursing , MSc Nursing in various disciplines , LLB The university campus has a 100 bedded Multi Specialty General Hospital in the name of "Maharaj Vinayak General Hospital". 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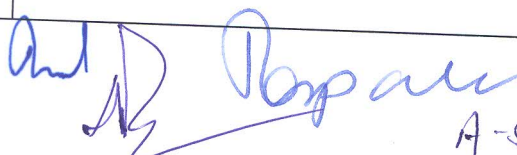
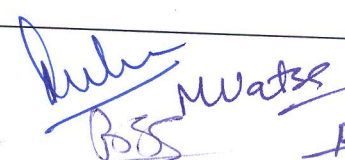

The Academic Council had approved the curricular on the recommendation of the Board of Studies and finally Board of Management had also approved it.

(refer 5.7 to 5.14)	The examination system of the University lacks clarity as different versions were given by the Vice Chairman and Controller of Examinations. The results are 100% which is not a norm in professional courses. The University is not following the recommended CGPA continuous evaluation system in the courses not governed by the councils.

(refer 6.1 and 6.7 of the format)	In Dental: As per Supreme Court Of India Guidelines 85% students are admitted from National Level Entrance Examination (PCPMT) conducted by Federation of Private Medical and Dental Colleges of Rajasthan and remaining 15% NRI on the basis of academic record and personal interview . Nursing: 50% students are admitted on the basis of state level examination (PMT) and remaining 50% are filled by the University on the basis of their academic record. Physiotherapy, Occupational Therapy, Arts, Commerce and Law students are admitted by the University on the basis of their academic record.
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(ii)	Do any special reservation on quota follow clearly laid down policy?	Information not provided UGC policy on reservations be followed.

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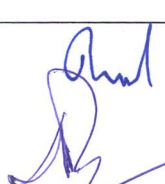
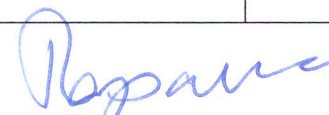

A few teachers did not fulfill mandatory qualifications.

Almost the entire Faculty has been appointed on contract with varying periods of contract which are fairly below the corresponding emoluments of teachers appointed in UGC scales

➤ Residential accommodation including hostels.	➤ There are 3 separate hostels in the campus one is for undergraduate girls with the accommodation of 167 girls and another for undergraduate boys with accommodation of 70 boys. ➤ No common room for the Girls in girls hostel. ➤ There is one Post Graduate hostel both for boys and girls with attached toilets and kitchen with 24 rooms. ➤ There are separate staff quarters for faculty as well as IV class staff. ➤ As per INC norms all undergraduate students are suppose to reside in the campus which does not seem to be a norm here.

(please give comments separately on faculties and departments)	➤ The university has not been able to develop any reasonable environment for research ➤ Only one article has been published in impact factor journal and that too by a junior faculty member of Dental College since inception of the University and even that article has not been cited. ➤ The Research labs are nonexistent despite the fact that the University is running a Research based doctorate program. ➤ Lacks advanced facility in basic medical sciences to support the research activities related to oral health sciences subject. ➤ Lacks adequate clinical material to support research. ➤ Statistical and Research methodology support is lacking to provide fundamentals of basic research facilities to scholars. ➤ The University also publishes its own journal quarterly viz. Journal of Medical & Dental Research (ISSN2277-1352)
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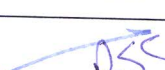
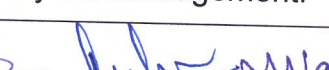
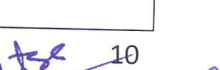

K. Strength and Weaknesses of the University

(i)	Strengths of the University	➤ The University is situated in rural area . ➤ Adequate space in constituent colleges. ➤ Because of its location in Jaipur , it can attract scholars from India and abroad ➤ Efforts are being made for students exchange programs with foreign universities.
(ii)	Weaknesses of the University	➤ Quality teaching learning process is severely affected due to almost all teachers on contract on fixed remunerations. ➤ Dedicated research labs are non existent ➤ Research profile of University is inadequate.. ➤ Senior faculty not oriented towards research ➤ Low occupancy of the hospital beds. ➤ No color coded waste disposal system in practice ➤ Inadequate clinical training of the students ➤ Institutional Ethics committee not as per ICMR norms ➤ Inadequate facility for sports for students. ➤ No blinded student feedback system in practice. ➤ Faculty development department is not there. ➤ Almost all faculty on fixed salaries without knowledge of pay scales. ➤ No ongoing research projects funded by the government of India funding agencies.

		➤ Inadequate student strength in LLB and Physical therapy programs as compared to sanctioned strength.
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Part-IV- Recommendations

A. General Observations and suggestions

The university still has to assimilate in the University system and still is working on the pattern of constituent colleges. Although the University is endeavoring to provide the courses in emerging areas but the focus is lacking and the evolution to the university system will take some time.

It is suggested that the University should follow the best practices of the well established universities which have been declared as elite universities under the University with Potential for Excellence scheme of UGC.

All standard operating procedures (SOPs) of well established universities should be followed in all areas of research, faculty recruitment, faculty development, infrastructure provision etc.

Academic planning and evaluation board should be set up for keeping the courses abreast with international standards.

The confusion created by the University by mentioning nine constituent colleges on the website, which even cover areas which come under the domain of AICTE has to be clearly understood and such aberrations should be avoided in future.

The act of the University empowers it to run distance education programs, however sufficient pre-requisites have to be ensured for launch of such programs, especially in view of the recent notification of UGC for all Universities and institutions that no new distance education programs be launched, without UGCs prior approval.

The present policy of the university to run the system with only financial support in the form of fee collected from the students has to be transformed to a futuristic approach of arranging funds for future development and quality enhancement.

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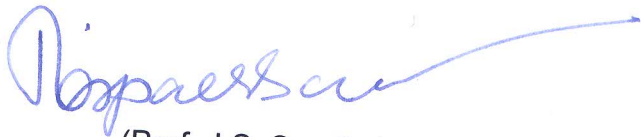
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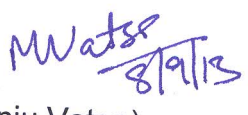
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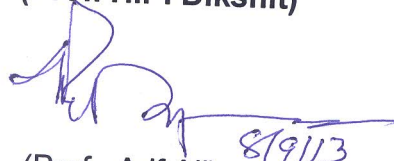
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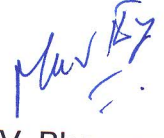
The committee has pointed some major deficiencies as UGC norms are not being followed so as on date the committee is not in favour of granting approval to the university.

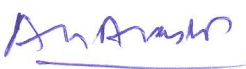

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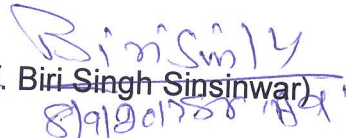
