(iii)	Brief description of the University and its faculties/courses	<p>It is a multi-faculty University offering UG, PG and Ph.D.programmes in the areas of Engineering and Technology, Architecture, Management, Commerce, Law and Education. The University has limited infrastructure in the form of classrooms, labs, library, play grounds, faculty resources, hostels, etc. to provide quality education to the students. 

**Part – IV – Recommendations**

**A. Observations of the Committee**

- Sincere and committed faculty
- 50% fee concession for the wards of staff / faculty



- Yet to develop outdoor and indoor sports facilities
- No common room for women students and faculty
- Buildings are not disabled friendly
- No dedicated examination / confidential section
- No staff / faculty housing on campus
- Industry – academic interaction is limited
- Many faculty members were recruited only during the last one year
- Faculty development programmes are very limited
- Professional societies' / bodies activities not seen
- Process and tools to evolve and improve curriculum not visible
- No support for student activities seen
- No evidence of remedial classes
- In the Department of Education, teaching – learning activities should be enhanced to be innovative

**B. Suggestion of the Committee which require satisfactory compliance by the University**

1. Independent Physiology lab needs to be established and as the course progresses, clinical labs also need to be developed;
2. Core Faculty in Physiotherapy should be recruited as per the norms of UGC;
3. Basic Health Sciences subject teachers should be from the respective specialization, including in anatomy and physiology;
4. Clinical materials in the form of patients should be made available for the students;
5. Independent classrooms shall be provided to the Department of Physiotherapy;
6. In the Department of Education, separate teacher training block should be set up with all mandatory labs and classrooms including smart classrooms;
7. Teachers should be appointed in the Department of Education as per the NCTE Regulations, 2014;
8. Designated faculty rooms with requisite facilities should be provided in all Departments;
9. Faculty members in Engineering Department should be appointed as per the norms of AICTE;
10. Architecture Department should have faculty as per CoA norms;
11. Adequate Lab space and equipments should be provided for the Engineering and Architecture Departments;
12. Keeping the location of the University, dedicated ambulance should be made available on campus along with first aid facilities on campus;
13. Multiple user access to Manupatra and other legal data bases should be made available to the law students and faculty;
14. Licensed software should be provided on campus, particularly Engineering Department;
15. More Supporting staff should be appointed as per norms;




**C. Final Recommendations**


The Committee after due physical and documentary evaluation, unanimously recommend that the University need not be accorded the recognition at this point of time as the University was established in 2013 and is yet to fully develop the infrastructure, labs and equipments etc., to meet the quality requirements of the UGC. However, the University is free to apply for UGC approval afresh after fulfilling the requirements.


